


Goals

This handbook is specifically developed as an outcome of EXCIITE Project's Result 4 (PR4). Below you can find the PR4 three main goals.

- To design a series of training modules that combine into flexible and personalised learning paths based on a self-assessment tool designed to help teachers recognize their own training needs.
- 2. To build a Hub for teacher training, consisting of a web repository of multilingual learning resources for teachers (building on what is already available in national teacher training agencies and at EU network level), to help them develop and practise creativity skills, learning innovation, self-regulatory learning, appreciation of diversity and social inclusion.
- To create an alliance of teacher education institutions capable of collaborating transnationally and supporting the exchange of resources and good practices in the field of in-service teacher education".

The map of our hub




The structure of our hub

3 TYPE OF RESOURCES



Core concepts

This resource helps users to have a deeper theorethical knowledge of the inspiring topic in general or in one of its possible declinations. Scientific publication (paper; chapter; book) or university lesson/talk are included.

Inspiring tools

These resources can motivate teachers and educators to put the inspiring topic into practice in their own educational work, in the classroom and at school. Guidelines (manuals, teaching instructions, guidance, ministerial-national documental, european document, erasmus products) are included.

Further ideas

These types of resources give suggestions or additional examples of how the topic can be developed, in theory or in practice. This category also includes resources that are relevant but refer to other websites (e.g. repositories or self-assessing digital tools).

1 English resources

The hub is composted by at least 1 English resource per type (1 for core concepts, 1 for inspiring tools and 2 for further ideas), which means that for each Inspiring topic the user will find at least 3 resources.



Criteria

To meet the quality criteria decided by partners, each resource in the hub must follow at least one option per criteria, which are Format, User Accessibility, Licensing and permission, Authorship, Diversity.



Format

- -MP3 (link)
- -MP4 (link)
- -Text (PDF)



User Accessibility

- 1.The OER does not require any registration for access to content.
- 2. The OER does not require a fee for use.
- 3. The OER does not require any registration for access to content and does not require a fee for use.



Licensing and permission

- 1. The OER is free to share, alter, and adapt, subject to some restrictions (e.g., CC-BY-SA or CC-BY-NC).
- 2. The OER is free to share, but not to alter or adapt (e.g., CC-BY-ND or CC-BY-NC-ND).
- 3. The OER is free to share, alter, and adapt,by mentioning the original author (e.g., CC-BY).



Authorship

- 1. The OER is a scientific publication
- 2. The OER is affiliated to institutions of higher education. Example: Harvard University.
- 3. The OER is produced by an institution, widely known for its involvement in the educational field (e.g. universities, international organization such as UNESCO, educational NGOs, national agencies for teacher training); education platform (e.g. OER hub).
- 4. Not educational institutions but related to field (e.g. TED TALK)



Diversity

- 1.The OER includes suggestions for ways to use the materials with a variety of learners;
- 2.The OER contains at least a criteria based on the cultural assessment of the partners who choose the OER: gender-inclusive language; cultural expressions (people from different cultures, socioeconomic background, religion, etc.); educational approach (i.e. different modalities).
- 3. Not applicable (i.e. a text about inclusive education but not formally referring to gender-inclusive language or a plurality of educational approaches, etc.)



Utility of materials Designed to support Teaching

- 1. The OER provides materials that are comprehensive and easy to understand and use. For example, the time needed for lesson planning appears accurately estimated, materials lists are complete, and explanations make sense, ages of students.
- 2. The object does include suggestions for ways to use
- 3. The OER does not include materials or suggestions for ways to use because the tools are sufficiently intuitive.

Each resource is translated in each language of the project, in order to widen the european network in the educational field


Feeding the hub: uploading resources



Each partner possess an admin account with which can feature the hub details and upoad resources




When uploading a resource, specifically made for the EXCIITE project, the owner of the resource is addressed among the project partners, as each of them has an account



Feeding the hub: uploading resources



To upload a big amount of resources, each partner can compile the excel file provided by Letzfair. The file must be completed in all his parts., following the instructions in it. Different files must be created for different languages and then send to UNIMORE staff.



Creative Common License: a hint

The Creative Commons licensing framework was created as a legal alternative to allow authors of materials to retain acknowledgement for their work and regulate the sharing, the commercial activity and the modification of materials. Creative Commons (CC) approach makes it possible to utilise user-friendly open licence for online and digital resources, taking into consideration different copyright laws in different countries and different languages.

Everyone can create a licence, the most appropriate can be generated by entering into the CC website and responding to specific questions.

Pictograms


Six licence types were created to form flexible copyright standards to meet the different needs of authors.


A licence may contain between 1 and 4 licence features (fig. 1), accompanied by a pictogram and an abbreviation.

BY indicates the attribution, i.e. the entity or person to whom the content is to be credited.

NC indicates 'Non Commercial', making explicit the prohibition to use the resource for commercial purposes. **SA**, which stands for ShareAlike, indicates that the content and any modifications of it may only be republished under the same type of licence.

From the combination of these 4 features, 6 licence types can be obtained (fig. 2), ranging from the most permissive CC BY, to the most restrictive CC BY-NC-ND licence.





The CC BY licence allows an unrestricted use of the content, if the following conditions are met:

"1. The author and other parties designated to receive attribution must be named in the


manner requested by the licenser as long as the requested form of attribution is reasonable.

2.If supplied by the licenser, copyright notices, a reference to the CC licence (preferably as a link to the CC website), a notice that refers to the disclaimer of warranty and liability and a link to the original source must be retained.


3. If the work is shared in an adapted version, it must be indicated that it is a modified version. Former indications to modifications must be retained (section 3.a.1.B of the legal code).

4.If the licenser requests to remove any of the information referred to in paragraph 2 above, the user has to do so as long as it is reasonable.

5. The licensee must not create the impression that their use is in any way endorsed by the licenser or any party designated to receive attribution (section 2.a.6 of the legal code)" (pag. 30).



The CC BY-SA attribution is known as the Wikipedia licence, which makes it widespread. In this particular type, "the adapter's licence must either be the original licence or any later version of that licence. (...) A hyperlink or other reasonable reference to the adapter's licence must be included. The use of the modified version must not be restricted by additional terms and conditions or TPMs.



The CC BY-ND apply the same terms of CC BY licence but does not allow adjustment of the work



The CC BY-NC licence does not allow users to reproduce the resource for commercial use; it indicates the respect of the same obligations as CC-BY.



The CC BY-NC-SA licence implies that a work can be adapted, further versions can be shared, but no commercial use of any form is permitted. An example of the application of the CC BY-NC-SA licence are the resources found in the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) Open CourseWare Project (OCW).



The CC BY-NC-ND licence does not allow modifications or commercial use, CC BY obligations are followed.
